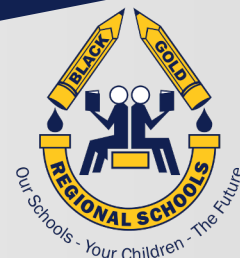

FIND YOUR SCHOOL

Every child enrolled in BGRD has a designated school. You can find your designated school by using our [Find a School](#) page.

BGRD has designated boundaries for all schools. Boundaries help to ensure optimal student populations that support viable programming across the Division. Please be aware that school attendance boundaries can and do change to allow for the efficient utilization of school facilities and resources and to allow for effective program planning.

Designated Schools Procedures

As required by the School Act, the Board will designate schools which will accommodate students residing within defined geographical areas of the Division and/or students requiring particular instructional programs.

The Superintendent will ensure that school designations remain current, are communicated to families and the public within the Division, and will establish and oversee administrative procedures to guide student relocations. The Division recognizes its obligation to accept as an enrolled student, a student residing outside a defined attendance area, if sufficient resources and facilities are available.

Applying to a School That is Not Your Designated Location?

Should a family wish to enrol their child in a school other than the designated school, the enrolment request will be considered a request to attend a **school of choice**. Acceptance to a school of choice will be based upon existing BGRD [policy and procedures](#) including availability or non-availability of space and resources.

READINESS

Determining if your child is ready to enrol into one of our Early Childhood Services programs ([Pre-Kindergarten](#) or [Kindergarten](#)) may seem like a daunting task. Here are some tips to consider when deciding if your child is ready.

Your child should be able to:

- Sit and listen to a story.
- Take direction from an adult other than a family member.
- Ask for help.

Your child does not need to be able to print his/her name, know letters and numbers, or be able to read. These are all skills that the children work on during Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten.

When making this decision, consider the readiness skills above, as well as:

- What are your child's social skills like? Do they play well with peers?
- What is your child's behaviour like? Can they handle frustration?
- What are your child's communication skills like? Can they express themselves and be understood by others?
- What is your child's maturity level? Many children are "young for their age" and may do better with waiting a year for Kindergarten.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN

We offer [Pre-Kindergarten](#) programs in many of the communities in which we operate including Beaumont, Calmar, Devon, Leduc and Thorsby.

In our play-based Pre-Kindergarten classes we believe:

Children may begin [Pre-Kindergarten](#) in a school within our Division in September if they are four (4) years of age by the end of the following February. Children who qualify for Program Unit Funding (PUF) may qualify if they are three (3) years of age by the end of the following February.

KINDERGARTEN

Many of our schools offer half-day Kindergarten programs, either in the morning or afternoon, with hours of operation varying from school to school. Others offer a full-day Kindergarten program, operating on alternating days. These are subject to change based on enrolment.

Kindergarten is a wonderful way for your child to discover what school is like and to have fun while learning new things. In this exciting new community, children's natural curiosity and eagerness to learn are structured through organized activities and purposeful play.

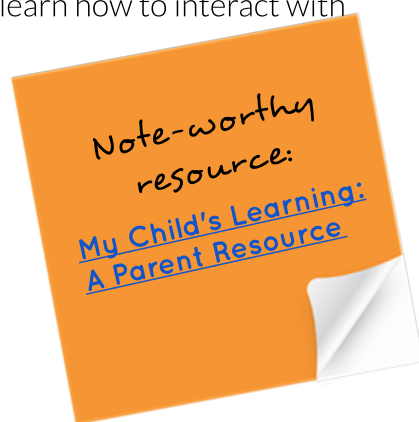
Our Kindergarten programs build on what your child has already learned at home and in your community. Our programs allow children to explore and experiment with their surroundings and to learn how to interact with other children.

Our Kindergarten programs offers many benefits, including:

- Further developed skills in language arts, math, social studies, science, and the arts.
- Improved personal and social skills.
- Enhanced physical skills.

Kindergarten Eligibility

Under BGRD's Administrative Procedures Manual, children may begin Kindergarten in September if they are five (5) years of age by the end of the following February. An exception is allowed in cases where special learning needs have been identified and an earlier entrance into Kindergarten is desirable.



EARLY FRENCH IMMERSION

Learning a Second Language with Black Gold Regional Schools

We offer [Early French Immersion](#) in our Beaumont and Leduc Family of Schools with the objective of providing full mastery of the English language, functional fluency in French, as well as an understanding and appreciation of the French culture. Our program is a highly effective way for students to become functionally fluent in French while achieving all of the objectives of a regular school program. The only difference is that they learn about math, health, science and social studies in French. In addition, they take French Language Arts.

INFORMATION

Outside of Leduc or Beaumont?

Your child may also access an Early French Immersion Program as a School of Choice student, meaning that they will attend a school that is not their designated school. Transportation may or may not be available and additional transportation fees may apply. In order to attend a School of Choice, you must receive permission from the applicable school's principal. You should also communicate directly with the BGRD Transportation Department regarding transportation options.

What are the benefits for my child?

According to Alberta Education's [French Immersion Kindergarten in Alberta: A Handbook For Parents](#), recent studies show that learning another language can not only have a positive impact on your child's first language, but also that it actually enhances learning in all areas. Current research has shown that exposure to a second language can:

- enhance the complexity of a person's first-language syntax;
- enhance their language-use skills (using narrative strategies, reading and writing in the first language, learning vocabulary);
- enhance non-linguistic skills in areas such as divergent thinking, metalinguistics, attitudes toward others and mathematics.

After learning more than one language, your child will also have a greater ability to learn additional languages.



ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMMING

The following schools offer Christian programming:

LINSFORD PARK SCHOOL

This non-denominational Christian program is based on the principles of the Logos program. Celebrations throughout the year such as Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter are celebrated as Christian celebrations. Devotions and a weekly chapel are an integral part of the program.

COVENANT CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

Covenant Christian School partners with the [Leduc Society for Christian Education](#) to encourage the growth and development of the school in keeping with its mandate to provide Christ-centered education to its students.



RESOURCES

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

We employ a multidisciplinary team comprised of Speech Language Pathologists, Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapists, Instructional Coaches and Educational Psychologists to provide support in our classrooms.

We also work with outside agencies and private contractors to provide additional support on an as-needed basis. These external consultants have expertise in the following areas: adapted physical education; audiology; teacher of the deaf or hard of hearing; visual impairment/blindness; and psychology.

Children with Special Needs

Our Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Programs are inclusive programs for children who meet Alberta Education's criteria for Early Childhood Services Programming.

Program Unit Funding (PUF)

Program Unit Funding (PUF), in addition to Base Instruction Funding, when approved by our Division, is available for young children who are at least two and half (2½) but less than six (6) years of age by September 1, and who have been identified with a severe disability/delay. Children are eligible for up to three (3) years of ECS funded programming, depending on age, severity of the disability/delay and its impact on the child's ability to function within an ECS program. The Standards for the Provision of Early Childhood Special Education apply to children who meet the eligibility criteria for special education programming.

Definition of Terms - How do I know if my Child is Funded or Non Funded?

A **funded student** would meet the criteria for Alberta Education Special needs funding for early intervention by having a mild, moderate or severe delay or diagnosis in: language development, motor development, deaf or hard of hearing, blind, or a diagnosed socio-emotional behavior disorder. They would receive this diagnosis from a qualified professional in that area and have a report and/or letter to support the diagnosis. ie. Speech-Language Pathologist, Psychologist, Geneticist, Glenrose composite report. etc.

NEW ONLINE ENROLMENT SYSTEM

New! Registration will be Processed Online

All families will be asked to register their child **online** via InfoSnap Registration.

A paper copy of the registration form **will not** be available.

What is InfoSnap?

InfoSnap is our new online enrolment system. InfoSnap will replace our annual paper registration packets, saving valuable time. The new system is a secure process that will allow the Division to verify all student information for every child prior to the start of the new school year.

Limited Spots

Please note, there are limited spots available in Pre-Kindergarten programs and we encourage families to register early to avoid disappointment. Also, **we may not be able to accommodate your preference with Pre-Kindergarten or Kindergarten, depending on student enrolment and program viability.**

The new online enrolment system will date/time stamp all registration in the system.

Beaumont Pre-Kindergarten Registration

Registration for Beaumont Pre-Kindergarten will also take place through the InfoSnap system. This is a centralized registration process, meaning that families will indicate the neighborhood they reside in and be placed accordingly. If non-funded Pre-Kindergarten programming demand exceeds availability, a draw will be held to select students from the names registered.

Families enrolling in Beaumont Pre-Kindergarten have until February 24, 2017 to be considered for the draw.



- All schools will have a kiosk/chromebook available for families that do not have access to a computer or the internet.



- Follow the link to the registration page.
- Families will **create an account** with PowerSchool Registration/Infosnap (this is not a PowerSchool Parent Portal account). Complete all the fields marked with a red asterisk.



- Once an account is created, a home screen will appear and you will have to "Start a New Form" to register your child.

Selected "New Student Registration

2017-2018" and then start entering all your child's registration information. If you have multiple ECS aged children, you will use the same account to register them.



How to Register - Continued

- Follow the instructions online to complete the registration. Complete all the fields marked with a red asterisk.
- The form will allow the family to choose their preferred program and indicate they would like busing. Please note, we may not be able to accommodate your preference, depending on student enrolment and program viability and this does not guarantee busing*.
- Registration cannot be completed at the school until all required documents have been provided to the school or uploaded.
- Birth certificates and citizenship documentation etc. can be uploaded via the online registration process (at the same time) or handed in at the school (by **April 28, 2017**).

SCHOOL FEES

We charge a variety of fees to provide quality programs and services for students. All fees are reviewed by the Board of Education in the spring for the next school year.

At the individual school level, additional fees are established and charged to cover the costs involved in delivering the programs or materials for which they are charged.

Pre-Kindergarten Monthly Payment Plan Option Available

\$80 deposit, plus \$80 monthly payments from October 1 - June 1.

KINDERGARTEN

All Kindergarten students are funded regardless of special needs code or not.

Acorn - Online Fee Payments

We use a fee management system called Acorn to streamline school and transportation fee payment processes for families and school administrators. Acorn is accessible through the PowerSchool Parent Portal.

With a few simple mouse clicks families can view assessed fees, print receipts and account statements, and pay for all of their children in a single transaction. If you are a family, who has multiple children at multiple schools, they will all appear together under your account.

What do you Need to use Acorn Online Payments?

You will need a PowerSchool Parent account. If you currently have an account, you will use the same username and password to login to the Acorn Online Payments website. If you do not have a PowerSchool Parent account your school will provide you with information on how to set up an account.

What are the Methods of Online Payment?

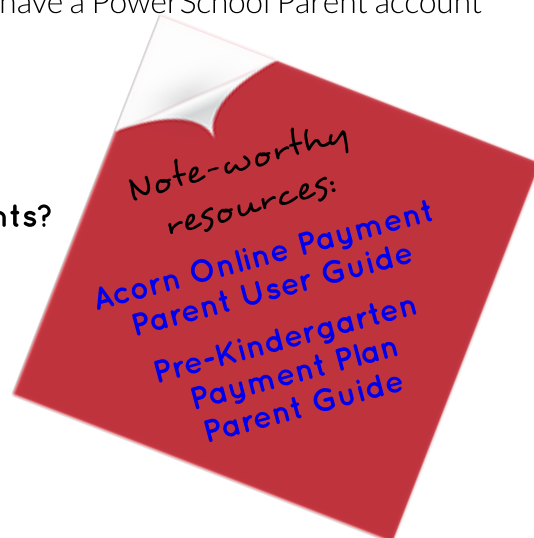
You can pay with Visa, Visa Debit, MasterCard, and Interac Online Debit.

What are the Costs Associated with Using Acorn Online Payments?

When using Acorn Online Payments, families will not be charged any convenience or transaction fees. They will only be charged for the cost of student fees.

Which Fees can be Paid Online?

BGRD instructional, option, field trips, sports, yearbook and transportation fees are all examples of fees that can be paid online.



What is PowerSchool?

PowerSchool is a web-based software application that allows teachers, families and school administrators to track and share information about students. Our schools use PowerSchool to manage student data such as grades and attendance and communicate with families regarding the school calendar, supply lists, etc. Families can view their child's information by logging into their PowerSchool account.

Securing a PowerSchool Account

How do I use Acorn Online Payments?

1. Visit the Black Gold Regional Schools website at www.blackgold.ca.
2. On the right hand side of the page, under Quick Links, click on "[PowerSchool – Parent/Student Connect](#)".
3. Log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal.
4. Click on the link 'Student Fees and Forms' in the sidebar navigation menu.
5. Review your child's fees.
6. Add any additional items to your shopping cart.
7. Checkout and pay for student fees.

Paying Offline

If you wish to pay offline, you must still create a PowerSchool Parent Portal. Once you can see your child's data in your account, you can then pay via cheque at your school.

With the exception of the Pre-Kindergarten Payment Plan Option, all cheques received for the 2017-18 school year will be receipted and deposited as soon as the child has been entered into PowerSchool, with the same deadlines that apply to online payments. These cheques cannot be held or post-dated for September 1, 2017.

Paying offline with the Pre-Kindergarten Payment Plan Option will require an \$80 deposit by April 28, 2017 plus 1st of the month post-dated cheques from October 1 - June 1.



TRANSPORTATION

PAY FEES ONLINE
AS OF JUNE 1, 2017

Black Gold Regional Division No. 18 successfully transports over 3,900 students on 74 bus routes to and from 31 schools, 182 days per year. This makes us extremely proud as safety is our number one priority!

Is Transportation Provided for Kindergarten Students?

Kindergarten students follow the regular BGRD Transportation policy and procedures. We provide student bus services to Grades K – 12 students who reside more than 2.4 kilometers from their designated school site.

Transportation *may also* be provided to students living less than 2.4 kilometers from their designated school, as well as students attending a school/program of choice. Families must contact the Transportation Department to determine if this is a possibility.

It should be noted if the Kindergarten Program is a half-day program, there is no busing available for noon hour, at the end of the morning program, or at the beginning of the afternoon program.

When families register online, they will be able to indicate that they would like busing. This will not guarantee a spot, but it will ensure that you are contacted by the Transportation Department, regarding your needs and eligibility.

Is Transportation Provided to Pre-Kindergarten Students?

We do not provide transportation to Pre-Kindergarten students.

Did you know?

There is a \$402 fine, victim surcharge & 6 demerits for passing the school bus when its red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended.

TRANSPORTATION ELIGIBILITY TERMS

ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

Reside more than 2.4 kms from their designated school including rural students. Fee listed below.

INELIGIBLE STUDENTS

Reside less than 2.4 kms from their designated school. Fee listed below. BGRD cannot claim these students for transportation funding.

SCHOOL OF CHOICE TRANSPORTATION

School of Choice transportation may be available in some cases and can only be confirmed by contacting the Transportation Department. An ineligible fee will apply, and meeting a bus may be required. Noon hour transportation is not available.

2.4 KM DISTANCE

Per Alberta Education funding parameters, 2.4 km is the shortest distance from the student's residence to the designated school (includes walkways, sidewalks, ditches, parkways, roadways, etc.). BGRD has an electronic routing system (accurate to within a metre) to determine distance eligibility. Driving a vehicle will not show the correct distance from the residence to the school. **NOTE:** Whenever new walkways, subdivisions or roads are built or connected, it will change the 2.4 kms distances to some areas depending upon the shortest pathway to the school.

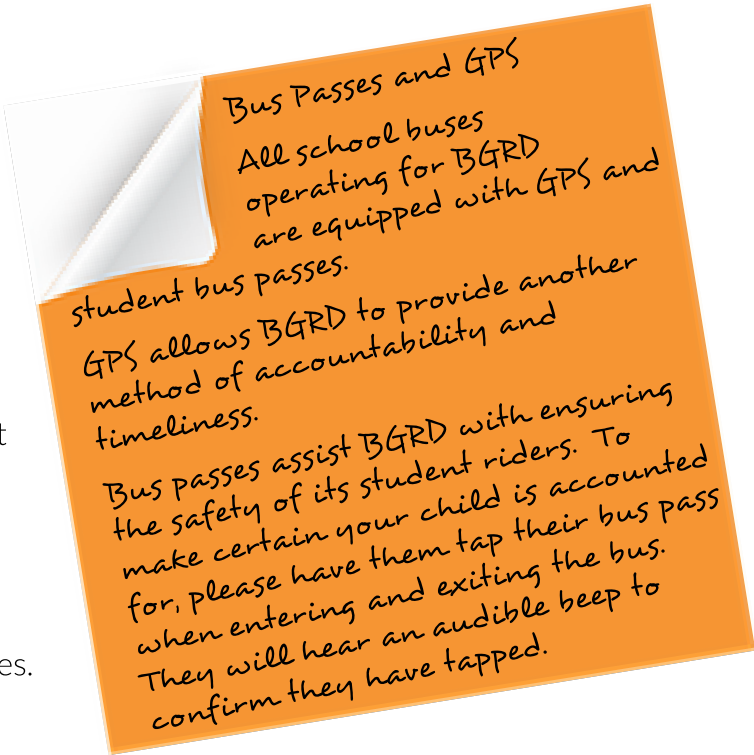

Families that selected busing for their Kindergarten child will be contacted by the Transportation Department regarding eligibility and fees.

Families that are eligible for transportation will be prompted by email to pay their transportation fees starting June 1, 2017.

To pay Transportation Fees (starting June 1, 2017):

- 1. Login to PowerSchool Parent Portal.
- 2. As of June 1, 2017, you may add the bus fee to your cart and pay online.
- 3. The \$25 bus pass fee is due immediately to generate the bus scan card.
- 4. The balance of the transportation fees can be paid in installments up to February 1st of the next year.
- 5. Once your transportation fee is paid, the department will mail out the scan card to your home address.
Note: We recommend you pay before June 30, 2017. Please allow enough time over the summer for this to take place.
- 6. Please add your caregiver arrangements, if this applies.



Please Note the Following Regarding Urban (in-town busing):

- Transportation is not door-to-door but stops are pre-determined and students are required to be at the stop five minutes ahead of the allocated stop time. Parents are responsible for supervision at the bus stop.
- If students are not at the stop, the driver will assume the student is not attending or a family member is taking the student to school.
- As the driver will not know if the student has been picked up by a family member due to appointments or other reasons, they will not be aware of who is riding home until the students get on the bus. Therefore, students are responsible to get to their bus after school and will be assisted by their teachers.
- At the end of the day, a parent or guardian is to meet the child at the bus stop.

Where will my Child will Catch the Bus?

When the bus pass is mailed, a link will be sent to you to access the data online with a secure log in.

First Ride Program

Our First Ride Program is offered in a two hour session facilitated by a transportation expert, teaching the ins and outs of school busing to your child in an interactive, entertaining format. Registration for the First Ride program will be in June and the form will be made available through PowerSchool , your school's and the Division's website.

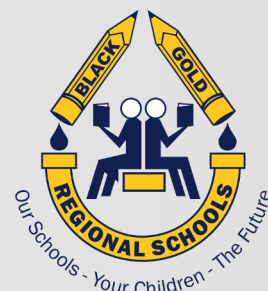
